

## **TUG HILL BLUEGRASS FESTIVAL CAMPGROUND POLICIES**

1. We regret because we do not have a campground permit that we are unable to open the campgrounds before 9:00 am on the Friday morning of the festival. All campers must exit the grounds by 9 pm Sunday evening so we can stay within our 60 hour annual camping limit as mandated by the state. Please respect our policies and we apologize for any inconvenience. Overnight parking prior to festival week-end may be available at one of the shopping plazas in town or the Lowville Mennonite Church parking lot, one mile north of the festival just off Rt. 812. Please call 315-376-2640 for more information.
2. We no longer supply fire rings or firewood. Small campfires with someone attending to them are permitted in the campground area. For safety reasons, please allow 10 feet between camper units, awning to awning.
3. All pets must be contained in campground area and on a leash at all times. No pets (other than service animals) are permitted in concert area.
4. The Maple Ridge Center is an alcohol free facility as are the surrounding grounds.
5. In addition to Porta-Jons dispersed throughout the grounds, there is running water and a bathroom in the maintenance barn by the road and one bathroom/shower combination each for men and women in the middle building at the back of the property. Water in all buildings is safe and potable. We ask that traffic into the main manor house for the indoor bathrooms be limited to handicapped and/or senior citizens needing those facilities.
6. Trash dumpsters are at the corner of the barn by the camping area. Space may be limited. Please take trash with you if dumpsters are full.
7. Most of our campground area is on firm level ground and holds up very well in rainy conditions. Special handicapped camping areas are located on the cinder horse track behind the performance tent.
8. Several drivers on golf carts are available to transport to and from concert area. Just give them a wave and they'll come get you.
9. Please use good judgment and be kind to your neighbors if you plan on holding a parking lot picking session. There are several buildings on the property and any of them may be used for after hours picking if desired.
10. Because of no campground permit, we have no electrical or water hook-ups or dump stations. All camping is free with a week-end ticket.

We have a reputation of having a very friendly staff. If you encounter any problems, please see someone at the gate, the festival promoter (Keith Zehr), or a member of the Atkinson Family Band. We believe bluegrass fans are the best and we are here to help!
